- International Youths Exchange program on the ship
- Organized by the Government of Japan since 1988
- Aiming to develop youth leaders in next generation, through the intensive training and interaction on board

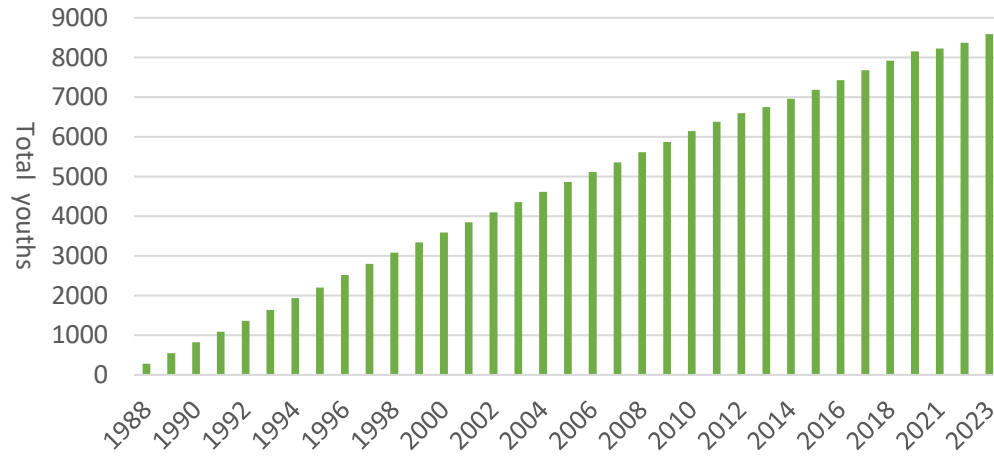

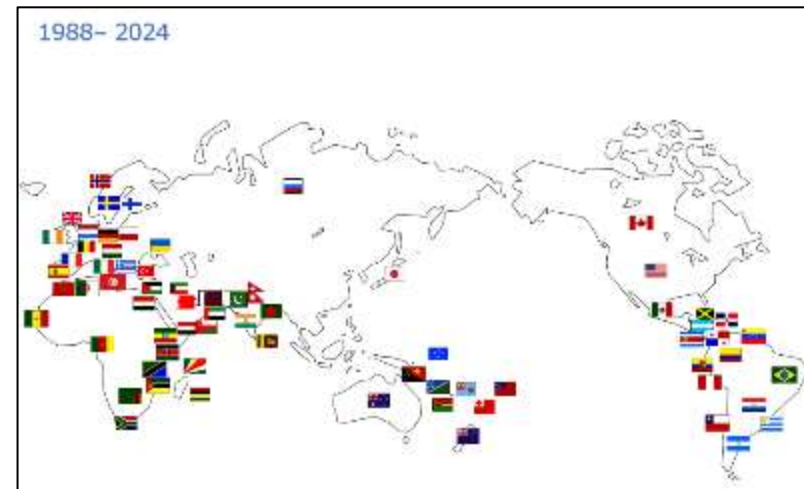
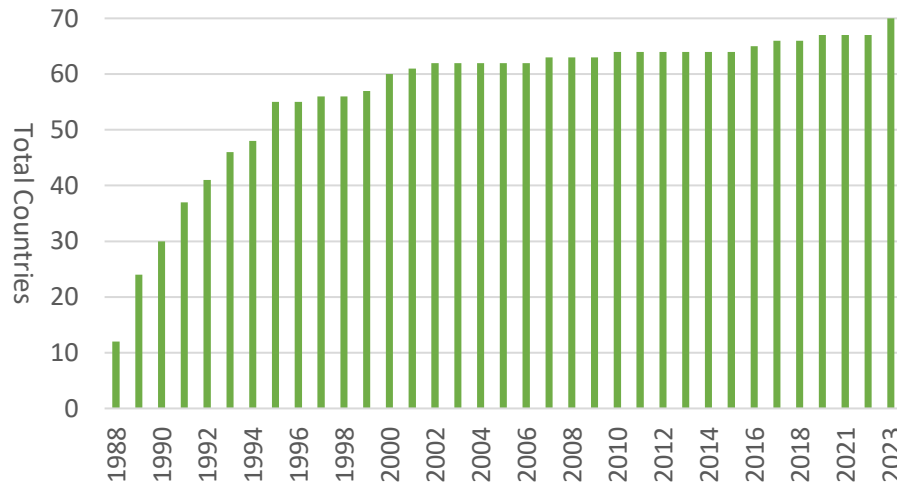

- Accommodation expenses (lodging and food) during the program
- Fees for official activities during the program
(e.g. entrance fees)



SWY 2026: Participants

■ Qualification

● Common qualification

- Must hold a nationality and be a resident of each participating country
- Must be in good physical and mental condition and can endure a long voyage

● Qualification of Participating Youth (PY)

- Must be 18 to 30 years of age as of April 1, 2025
- Must have no prior experience in the SWY program (Excluding ex-PYs of the online program)

● Qualification of National Leader (NL)

- Must have the ability to lead his/her own country's youth

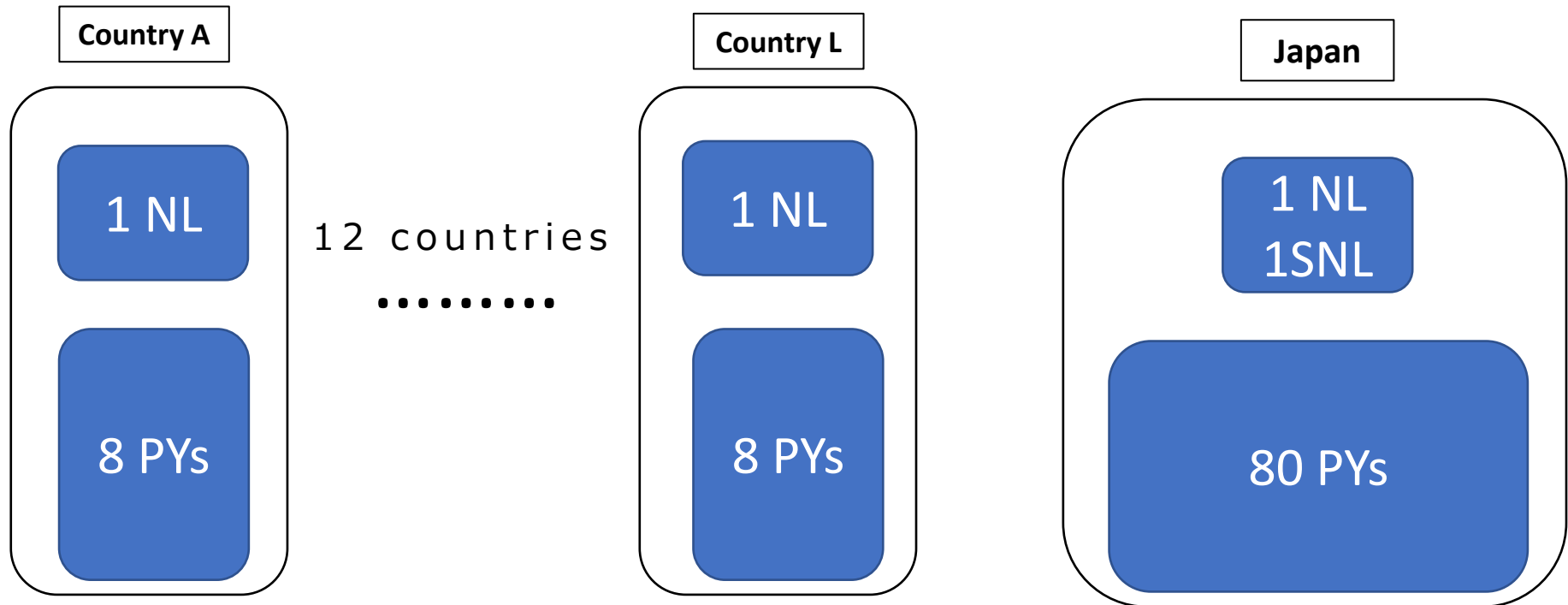
* There are other qualifications for participation in addition to those listed above.

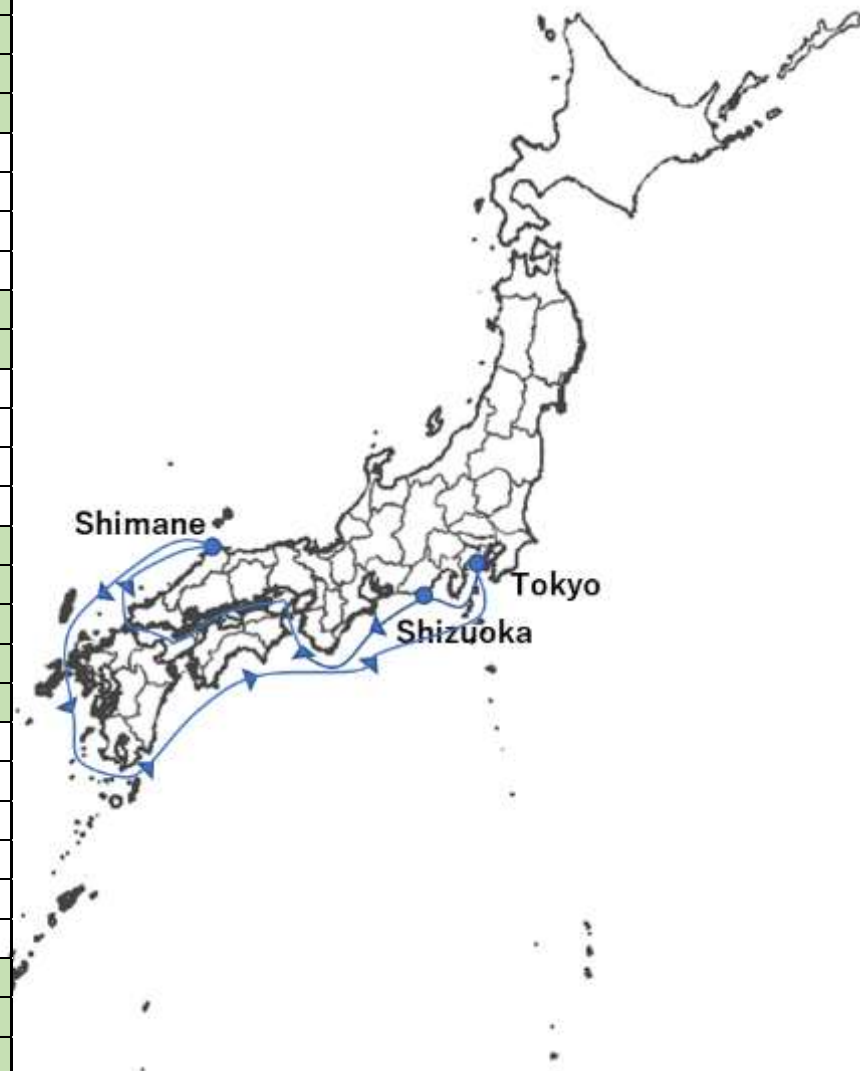
