*Cruising course was limited within the Japanese territorial waters during SWY 2024 - 2025






The first voyage crossing the Panama Canal (1989)




Number of SWY Alumni as of April 1, 2024

SWY 2026: Requests to Government of participating countries and Cost-bearing of the Japanese Government

Requests to Government of participating countries

- Recruitment, selection and nomination of Participants from their own country
- Attendance at an online briefing session (Scheduled to be held around June 2025)

- Round-trip airfare to Japan
- Travel insurance fee during the program
- Accommodation expenses (lodging and food) during the program

SWY 2026: Participants

Qualification

Common qualification

- Must hold a nationality and be a resident of each participating country
- Must be in good physical and mental condition and can endure a long voyage

Qualification of Participating Youth (PY)

- Must be 18 to 30 years of age as of April 1,2025
- Must have no prior experience in the SWY program (Excluding ex-PYs of the <u>online</u> program)

Qualification of National Leader (NL)

 \cdot Must have the ability to lead his/her own country's youth

* There are other qualifications for participation in addition to those listed above.










SWY 2026 : Participants


